For the Sake of Others (Philippians 2:1-4)

One of the most difficult mindsets to attain is that a Christian lives for the sake of others. This is not a new idea. This is not the by-product of some soft-minded, gushy-hearted spirituality. This idea is central to a biblical understanding of what it means to be a genuine Christian -- to be truly Christ-like rather than a person playing at discipleship.

The Mindset of Jesus

Listen to the emphasis that Paul penned on this idea as he writes to the Christians at Philippi: "Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion (Phil. 2:1). Translation: If Jesus has made any real dent on you ... if being his follower has had any real effect on you ... then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind." (2:2) With all people who are like you? With all the folks you naturally like or who like you? No, says Paul. Have the same love, spirit, and mind as Christ.

As Christians, we don't think we need to do this anymore. Christians know they are beloved children of the almighty God of the universe. They have seen the most brilliant and beautiful being, greater than the universe itself, proclaim them so beloved that he would suffer and die for them. Christians know they are heirs to a glorious heaven. They have an identity and security that is unimpeachable. And it takes a lifetime to fully live into that reality. If you get this, it is liberating you from a self-focus toward an other-focus.

Paul understood that this shift of orientation takes time for all of us. This is why he writes this letter to the believers at Philippi. He knows we are always being tempted to go back to the natural, sinful, human way of looking at things and coming at life. We are feeling the pull to make our school days, our job, our marriage, our politics, and our church life a lot about us or our tribes. But "rather in humility, value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others" (Phil. 2:3-4).

I'm not suggesting you don't matter. You have an identity, gifts, and wisdom that are needed in this world. Don't think less of yourselves. Just think of yourself less as Jesus models.

Dear Churches United Delegates and Board:

With the surge of COVID-19 infections I want to take this opportunity to share with you information on COVID-19 precautions our host church has taken to host the upcoming Churches United Delegate Assembly.

Please keep in mind that if the number of diagnosed cases increases in Rock Island County to the warning category, our meeting will take place with board members only via ZOOM.

For the Safety of all of our members TBC will do the following:

- Blaze Restoration will sanitize our building in preparation for our Delegate Assembly 3 days in advance of our meeting.
- Temperatures will be taken and recorded prior to entering the sanctuary. Temperatures of 100.4 will be asked to return home.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be available in the vestibule prior to entering the sanctuary. Hand sanitizer must be used each time an individual enters or leaves the sanctuary.
- Masks are required when entering the building and worn throughout the our annual meeting
- Seating will be measured to ensure proper social distancing. Ushers will be directing individuals and families to their seats. The vestibule will be used for entering and exiting the sanctuary. No gathering.
- Offering will be conducted in offering boxes inside the sanctuary doors.
- Ushers will dismiss services row by row to avoid crowding.

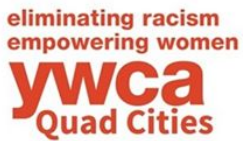

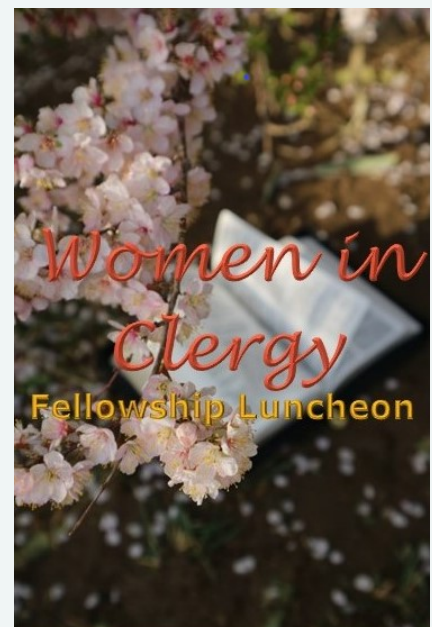
