Courage to Stand

We find ourselves moving rapidly toward the celebration of our nation's birth. Yet, there are many issues that face this country including the separation of those who have much from those who struggle for the resources of life. The increased separation of opinion by differing people so that compromise becomes almost impossible has only increased. We could go on and on about issues, real life issues that need attention and leadership, yet many of our political representatives are focused on the destruction of the opposition, instead of how we can address these various issues.

One quality that needs to be held up for all leaders but possibly more for those who want to stand for public service is the quality of moral courage. Can someone stand for some important approaches to problems with the courage to offer clarity, even when the audience may not be totally supportive?

In the Biblical narrative, we can often meet leaders who lack this quality of moral courage. I am thinking of Herod who had John the Baptist executed not because he truly believed that he was dangerous to the country but because he would be embarrassed to change a promise made to a stepdaughter. We can also meet Pilate who clearly knew that Jesus of Nazareth did not in any way deserve death, yet he would not stand for the right against the clamoring of the crowd.

I am reminded of an old movie that has been on the cable channels of late entitled Twelve Angry Men, starring Henry Fonda. The setting is the jury room where I2 men who are a jury to determine the guilt or innocence of a young Puerto Rican man accused of murdering his father. In the beginning, I I of the men see him as guilty while one man votes not guilty because he is not sure, and he feels that if a life is in the balance, time and serious deliberation is demanded. By some, this man is ridiculed for his inability to see clearly. For others, this is just a delay keeping them from other activities. The question for us as an audience as we observe this drama is how does one man stand against the wishes of the many, even when his conscience demands a varied course? Had he accepted the course of least resistance, a young man who this jury later followed the evidence to determine that he likely was not guilty, might have been executed for an offense he did not commit.

As we look at the issues that divide our country: race, adequate health care, lack of civility, etc., we must ask ourselves, are we willing and able to offer the courage to stand for a position, a belief, instead of looking for the "spin" that will absolve our conscience of avoiding the truth. We have some important challenges, and they demand our courage as Christians to provide the compassion and courage to provide the leadership necessary to bring about in the words of the Battle Hymn of the Republic, "His Truth Is Marching On."


