Justice



On August 28, 1963, the late Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. delivered his iconic "I Have a Dream" speech in Washington D.C. One of the key thoughts that emerged from that speech was lustice.

Justice. Who wants justice? Who speaks about justice? Who pursues justice? Who is willing to sacrifice for justice? The church? The business community? The political establishment? The academy? The activists? Who wants justice for "We the People?" In a real sense, all of us should be proponents of justice, and Christians, in particular, should be courageous voices and vessels for justice. Sadly, the pursuit of justice is nonexistent in far too many sacred spaces. Unfortunately, this reality reveals the hypocritical nature of both the church and society.

Nevertheless, we must remember that the pursuit of justice is a biblical pursuit. It is a biblical mandate for all who claim to be followers of Jesus Christ. The God of the Bible is the "God of justice" (Isaiah 30:18 NIV). God is not an inactive and abstract deity unconcerned about social injustices in the world. God is an active and personal God working through humanity to produce justice in the world. Hence, the nature and character of God encompass justice. As a result, God calls and demands society to prioritize justice. For example, Micah 6:8 declares, "He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Micah echoed the profound theme that living out God's justice is more important than performing the correct sacrificial rituals before God (Micah 6:6-7).

The word "require" demonstrates action done in an uninterrupted state -- it neither starts nor stops. It is never-ending, showing that action defined by the verb is going on all the time. Hence, pursuing justice is to be the ongoing pursuit of the Christian. Therefore, Christians are called upon to remind the church and culture that the pursuit of justice is a continuous lifelong one worthy of our attention and resources.

Therefore, "But let justice run down like water, and righteousness like a mighty stream" (Amos 5:24)
