



## Life in the Overflow



Would you consider yourself a grateful person? With the Thanksgiving season upon us, we would do well to ponder that question. After all, we are called to emulate Jesus, and His life was characterized by gratitude. Throughout His ministry, He regularly expressed his thanks to the Father. Before breaking the bread and fish to feed thousands of people, He paused to give thanks (Matt. 15:36). Prior to raising Lazarus from the dead, Jesus stood at the tomb and thanked the Father for hearing the prayer that was about to be answered. (John 11:41) And just hours before His own death, Jesus expressed gratitude as He blessed the bread and wine of the new covenant (Mark 14:22-23).

How about you? Are you communicating gratitude on a regular basis? The Christian's life should be characterized by it. However, becoming a thankful person is not a matter of self-effort. Genuine thankfulness flows from a grateful heart, and a grateful heart comes from Christ's life expressed through us. It's not simply about choosing to try and be more grateful. Rather, it's a daily choice to surrender control of our life to the Lord. That's when he/she is free to demonstrate His character through us.

So, what does it look like when Christ transforms us into grateful people? First, we'll be filled with confidence in the Lord and His word. Knowing that He's working everything out for our good (Rom. 8:28) and developing within us the priceless treasure of faith, we can respond with gratitude, even in painful trials (I Peter I:6-7)

Next, we will recognize Him as the source of all good things. Contentment and peace will be evident in our life because we will understand that whatever God chooses for us is best, whether much or little. In fact, our appreciation will be based not on externals but on the joy of our relationship with Christ.

## **Year-End Appeal**

Have you given to our year-end appeal? Your donation will go to supporting our food pantries, hot meal site, CareLINK program, and Winnie's Transitional Housing.

We have encountered numerous challenges at Winnie's Transitional Housing. Due to the cold weather that we had in February 2022, the pipes burst in Winnie's Transitional Housing causing damage to all six units. All units need renovations. We have updated the emergency shut-off valves in all of the units, but there is still quite a bit more to do in order for us to start taking in clients.

Another Churches United ministry to consider in your decision to give is our food pantries. During the last two years due to the pandemic, we have seen a drastic drop in donations both in monetary and through perishable and non-perishable food items. The food banks, as well as our food pantries, are struggling to get food on the shelves to feed the many families in need.



We are also hosting a hot meal site at Zion Lutheran Church in Davenport Monday through Friday providing a meal from our area churches. At our meal site, we are feeding over 100 people each evening. We are serving a lot of desperate families. Our meal site and food pantries have consistently served over a million meals annually and we hope to be able to continue to serve our community at this level. The expenses are real and are not letting up anytime soon.

Churches United is a Christ centered ministry and we assist those in need with dignity, compassion, and patience, just as God has shown us to do for others. We are a staff of three, yet we still get as much ministry done as we can. Please prayerfully consider making a contribution to our organization.
