## God is Still in Charge



The late theologian A. W. Tozer stated: "While it looks like things are out of control, behind the scenes is a God who has not surrendered His authority."

It is easy to feel that things are out of control. The pandemic dilemma has divided our country, community, and our churches. We are divided politically; the very foundation has been challenged by the insurrection on

January 6, 2021. We are divided racially. With the death of George Floyd, our country was brought face to face with the specter of hatred of other nationalities, cultures, and religious beliefs. And the list goes on.

With all the voices clamoring for our attention, it is easy to forget one small voice. God is near, He is with us and for us, and He is in charge. He never leaves us, never takes vacations, or comes and goes. There is nothing, according to the Apostle Paul, that can separate us from the love of God. This is the quiet confidence in which Jesus lived. This is the same quiet confidence that He offers all who follow Him.

I want to share this passionate description of our confidence in God.

"In prayer, you ask for things and give thanks for things. Why? Because you recognize that God is the author and source of all the good that you have had already, and all the good that you hoped for in the future. This is the fundamental philosophy of Christian prayer. The prayer of a Christian is not an attempt to force God's hand, but a humble acknowledgment of helplessness and dependence. When we are on our knees, we know it is not we who control the world; it is not in our power, therefore, to supply our needs by our own independent efforts; every good thing that we desire for ourselves and for others must be sought from God, and will come, if it comes at all, as a gift from his hands...In effect, therefore, what we do every time we pray is to confess our own impotence and God's sovereignty. The very fact that a Christian prays is thus proof positive that he believes in the Lordship of his God." from Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God by JL Packer

So, whatever may come, let us keep our focus on Him.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. (Hebrews 12:1-3 NIV)




